BY THE TIME WE FOUND THIS THE DIFFERENCE IN SIZE (ESPECIALLY OVERALL SIZE & THE SHAPE OF THE BILL) & COLORATION WAS QUITE PRONOUNCED. THE RING-BILLED (1st yr. IS MUCH WHITER OVERALL, ESPECIALLY UNDERNEATH & GRAYER ABOVE. THE SPOTTING ON THE BREAST OF THE RING-BILLED WAS MORE DISTINCT. ALSO, IN FLIGHT THE RING-BILLED GULL'S TAIL BAND IS THINNER SHOWING MUCH MORE WHITE; THE PRIMARIE WERE ALSO DARKER IN THE RING-BILLED.

A LONER. NOT MUCH INTERACTION WITH OTHER GULLS. IT IS MISSING AT LEAST TWO PRIMARIES IN THE LEFT WING. WHEN IT FLEWITS FLIGHT WAS
