

## No. Parula Warbler.

Seen Dec 13<sup>th</sup> 1990. in the trees in front and back of the Red Iguana Restaurant. 736 W. North Temple. The Bird was first observed at 10 AM by myself and then again at 11:30 by Craig Kneely & myself. Total the Bird was observed for 45 minutes from distances ranging from 6 ft. to 50 ft. The bird was observed thru 8x24 binoculars in bright light conditions. The weather was cloudy - that night a snow storm left up to 4 inches of snow in this area. The warbler was quite small seeming about  $\frac{1}{2}$  the size of a ♀ House sparrow seen next to the Bird on one occasion. The Bird was quite active primarily feeding on apples from the trees in front of the Restaurant. The Warbler was generally bluish gray on top with a greenish <sup>upper</sup> back patch. The belly of the Bird was white or were the undertail coverts. The throat & breast were yellow with the yellow extending up thru the chin & lower Bill (~~mandible~~ mandible) across the yellow breast were two bands of color one ~~dark~~ almost the color of the back and another band a rust color. The Warbler has a split eye ring similar to a Macgillivray's Warbler. a dark line split the eye ~~by~~ ring. The Bird had a short tail
